Rules for bibliographic description of works cited in publications on the LIBRe Stories Platform

- Referrals to monographies or other independent works

The bibliographic description in this case shall include: name of the author in an inversed manner – surname, followed by first name or an abbreviation thereof, separated by comas (i.e. "Petrov, Ivan" or "Petrov, I."), heading (and sub-heading if available) of the work, place of publication, name of the publisher, year of publication, volume edition (if more than one). The name of the author, the heading and the publishing info shall be separated by full-stops. The place of publication and the name of the publisher shall be separated by a colon, whereas the name of the publisher and the year of publication – with a coma.

I.e.:

Yavorov, P. Selected Works. Sofia: Scorpio, 2003.

- Referrals to articles in newspapers, magazines, weeklies or other periodicals

The bibliographic description in this case shall include name of the author in an inversed manner, heading of the article, sub-heading (if available) name of the publisher, which publishes the periodical, year of publication, number of the edition, pages, where the article can be seen (from-to), place of publication and name of the publisher.

The title of the periodical shall not be written in italics and shall not be placed between double quotation marks.


The name of the author, the heading of the article and the publication information shall be separated by full-stops. A long indent "–" shall be put after the full-stop separating the heading of the article and the title of the periodical.

The place of publication and the name of the publisher shall be separated by a colon.

The volume edition shall be written in a format as "No.", followed by the Arabic numeral of the edition. I.e. "No. 3"

When referring to a specific page the description shall include the abbreviation „p." followed by the number of the page written in Arabic numerals. When referring to a specific set of pages (from-to) the description shall include only the page numbers written in Arabic numerals without any abbreviations.

I.e.:

- Referrals to works from a book of collected works, arrangements or any other types of collectives

A long indent “–” shall be put before the information about the collective book followed by “In:”. The data about the collective shall be written after the information about the author, the heading and the sub-heading of the referred work and shall include the name of the collective, year of publication, the volume edition number (if available) written in Arabic numerals and preceded by “No.” (i.e. “No. 3”), pages from the collective, where the referred work can be seen. All the separate parts of information about the collective shall be separated with comas.

I.e.:

Sergeev, Zh. The impact of wine in Ancient Greece. – In: Historic thought, 1995, No 2, p. 31. Sophia: Aristotle.

- In the case of a repeated referral to an already described work the bibliographic description shall include the name of the author, followed by “Op. cit.” replacing all the previously described information about the work.

I.e.:

Sergeev, Zh. Op. cit.

- If the same work is referred to two or more consecutive times, the description shall include only “Ibidem”.

I.e.:

Sergeev, Zh. Op. cit.

- In case of a repetitive referral (a second or further, consecutive or non-consecutive) to an already described work (regardless of the type of source – book, article, periodical, etc.) where other works from the same author have been already referred to in the text, the bibliographic description shall include: the name of the author, the abbreviated title of the work, a series of dots (...) a coma and the page number(s) from the work, written in Arabic numerals where the referred section of the text can be seen (if the referral is to a specific section in the text).

I.e.: *Sergeev, Zh. The impact of..., p. 54.*

- Referrals to specific pages

Where a single page from a work is referred to the description shall include the abbreviation “p.”, followed by the page number in Arabic numerals. This is not applicable where a range of pages is referred to. In these cases the description shall include only the page interval (from-to, separated by a short dash “-”), without any abbreviations “p.”.

I.e.:

Yavorov, P. Selected works, p. 21. Sofia: Scorpio, 2003.
